I was brought in to help the Digital team at British Red Cross - a team of incredibly talented individuals who were not delivering on their product mission because of a number of interconnected factors.

- Culture, cohesion and communication: Following my work with the delivery team, everyone was excited about estimating the size of tasks, people were talking openly about their work every day, and everyone was coming together once a week to play board games.
- Engineering leadership: I worked with the engineering team to develop their understanding of the larger or more nuanced technical challenges and supported them to advocate for the best solutions.
- Leadership coaching: I mentored the engineering lead throughout the contract to take a more active role in the leadership of the wider team.
- As a leadership team member: I worked with them to build realistic and exciting goals for the product that everyone could get behind, and to actually deliver on those goals in a regular and repeatable way.
- Equity, diversity & inclusion: I supported marginalised members through coaching, setting up support circles and being visibly trans and autistic myself. I gave a well received talk on Nonviolent Communication at the tech team away day.

By the time I left, the product had actually started shipping regularly after years of not being able to!

I ran the engineering team at Citizens Advice: 40+ software engineers working across 11 digital products. 3 levels of line management with 6 immediate reports, including all the tech leads.

During my time as head of engineering, I created and oversaw the first few years of a major transformation towards a devops culture, including:

- Treating the deployment platform as a product and re-imagining infrastructure engineering as site reliability engineering
- Cultural transformation in product teams to owning their own non-functional requirements, shifting test engineering left and adopting dev/prod parity and continuous deployment
- Introduction of a community of practice to encourage sharing between product teams
- Various progression / capability framework changes to encourage a more diverse team with fewer power imbalances, including the introduction of an associate programme for newly qualified engineers

Holding a retro at the start of 2024, I validated the hypothesis that this transformation has made for happier, more engaged and more productive engineers and higher quality outcomes for stakeholders.

In this time I was also an active member of the national leadership team of Citizens Advice, taking on challenges related to national decision-making processes and recruitment & retention.

I was directly responsible for the initial tech (all in Ruby on Rails) at Noiiz, Care View, Improve Your Accent, Digital Urban, Socialaser, Gigappy and more.

This period also included a Ruby devops contract at William Hill, during which I was named the MVP for open-source VM toolkit fog.io.

I was always dedicated to open source where possible and made dozens of pull requests to upstream projects as well as releasing gems of my own including the popular administrate-field-lat_Ing. My proudest moment was getting a PR merged to core Rails itself!

I kept the business open during my time at Citizens Advice, focussing on my own product development, which has come to fruition in the second incarnation!
